Locations:

Wednesdays/Thursdays: Lessons held at 1st Presbyterian Church, 540 S Main St, Kalispell
*please enter through the side door off of 6th St, can park in back lot or on the street

Calendar:

I will be following the calendar that I handout at the first lesson. This will show scheduled days off for holidays, professional development, recital dates, group lesson weeks, and other irregularities in the schedule.

Materials:

Please bring a notebook for assignments and all relevant lesson materials (books, loose sheet music, etc.)

Practice expectations:

Daily practice is extremely important for progress in piano lessons. That means, you need to practice every day! A good rule of thumb is to practice the same amount of time as the length of your lesson each day. The more prepared you are, the more we can cover.

Tuition:

Please pay tuition no later than the 1st lesson of each month.

Your monthly rate guarantees 10 lessons/3 months, NOT 4 lessons per month. Monthly rates do not change if there are only 3 lessons, or 5 lessons in a month.

Payments can be made by check, cash, venmo, paypal, or zelle.

Makeups/Reschedules:

Makeups are not guaranteed for missed lessons. As long as we get 10 lessons/3 months, makeups are not offered. In the case that we will be unable to do 10 lessons in a 3-month period, makeups may be scheduled, usually on Fridays or Saturdays. In the case we are unable to schedule a makeup, we will settle up monetarily.

Rescheduling will be very challenging this year as I have a full and tight schedule. Generally speaking, rescheduled lessons will not be possible, though I will do my best.

Recitals:

All students are expected to participate in all recitals, including the KAMTA Spring Festival, April 25-26. Each recital is preceded by a "group lesson week" in which students play their recital pieces for each other in a group class setting. These group lessons count toward the 10 lesson guarantee.
